HVUT Tax & Form 2290 Filing Checklist for Truckers

Step 1: Gather Vehicle Information

- Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) for each taxable vehicle
- Taxable gross weight (weight category of the truck)
- First month the vehicle was used on public highways
- Business name and address
- Employer Identification Number (EIN) SSN not accepted
- Vehicle category (regular, suspended, or agricultural)

Step 2: Verify Eligibility

- The vehicle has a taxable gross weight of 55,000 pounds or more
- The vehicle is registered or required to be registered in your name
- The vehicle is used on public highways
- The vehicle is not exempt (e.g., government, blood collector, or nonprofit vehicle)

Step 3: Calculate HVUT

- ■ Determine the tax period (July 1 June 30)
- Calculate the HVUT due based on weight and usage month
- ■ Check if suspended (Category W) vehicle applies (under 5,000 miles, 7,500 for agriculture)

Step 4: Choose a Filing Method

- E-file Form 2290 with an IRS-authorized e-file provider
- Or mail the paper Form 2290 to the IRS (only for ≤25 vehicles)
- Keep a copy of your IRS Schedule 1 (proof of payment)

Step 5: Select a Payment Option

- Electronic funds withdrawal (EFW)
- Electronic Federal Tax Payment System (EFTPS)
- Credit/debit card payment
- Check or money order (if filing by mail)

Step 6: File and Receive Schedule 1

- Submit Form 2290 by August 31 (or end of the month following first highway use)
- Download/print IRS-stamped Schedule 1 as proof of payment
- Provide Schedule 1 to DMV for vehicle registration/renewal

Step 7: Keep Records

- Keep filed Form 2290 and Schedule 1 for at least 3 years
- Maintain mileage logs for suspended vehicles
- Keep EIN and vehicle documents securely stored

Bonus Tips

■ File early to avoid IRS penalties and interest

- Double-check VINs incorrect VIN = invalid Schedule 1
- If VIN correction needed, file Form 2290 VIN Correction
- If truck is sold, file Form 2290 Amendment or Credit Claim (Form 8849)
